## NOTES REGARDING MY (JK'S) SELECTION PROCESS FOR THE HALL OF GREATNESS

I first teased that I was finally considering doing this back in the week 13 issue of the Spring 2020 season (which, at the time during a pandemic, had very little to do with actual "week 13" of anything). Maybe I decided to undertake it as a nod to the hope that we would one day return to our normal hobbies and functioning. (We mostly have.) Maybe I decided to undertake it because I just missed everybody and this was fun to ponder. (I did, and it is.) Or maybe I decided that I just had so much more down time for a while that I could finally give in to the people who had been asking me to write one of these for going on about fifteen years now. (I did, I could, and they had been.) But for whatever the final reasons were in my head, I eventually decided to give these selections a great deal of thought, and I took this task VERY seriously. Below are the criteria that I generally employed when thinking about this, and I can tell you that after mulling this over for (literally) a couple years now, I am more certain than ever that I have made the exact proper selections for this Inaugural Class of the Hall. Will there be more inductees in the Hall? Maybe (see point \#5 below), or maybe not. But I feel like I already know who the most likely future candidates could be, if ever there are any...

The criteria notes that I first presented with my teaser three years ago (and from which I have not swayed to this day):
\#1 - This is be MY opinion, and is not any official recognition from the RDL in any way (although the Board did very graciously step in on the award cost, so they must not think I'm "too much" of an idiot). So if you end up with a problem with the choices, take them up with me and me only (or... don't :o).
\#2 - I will not call this a Hall of "Fame", because being famous in RDL land is nowhere near enough to be included. Fulton Crowley is RDL-famous for being such a terrible captain that we changed a rule in response to his behavior; Danny Caputo is famous for being banned due to some pretty crazy behavior; and Richard Oakley and Brett Speight are famous for being premeditated fake identity roster cheaters. All famous, none of them great. Thus, none of them included.
\#3 - I had not at the time of writing these initial criteria fully decided who would be chosen, or even the exact number that would be chosen. 2? 5? 8? Wasn't sure then. But do know this... the players chosen (both now and if there any additional in the future) will always be longtime RDL members with many years of continuous active membership, each carrying sustained success for many many many years, and only play at the highest level will even be considered as a criterion.
\#4 - Additional success in other local leagues, state leagues, and state and national championships is a nice extra, but this is the RDL Hall, so if a person isn't a sustained RDL legend, the rest of the stuff won't make up for that fact.

And finally, \#5 - this might be the ONLY time that I ever induct somebody into my personal Hall. It took me 25 years to agree to induct anyone at all, so I'm certainly not going to dilute the pool with any sort of regular or guaranteed addition to the club. Maybe I add one or two throwers very soon. Or maybe I write the Tons for another twenty years and never add another soul. I have taken this selection VERY seriously, and have actually had this in the back of my head off an on for quite a while now, so I will be in no hurry to add just for the sake of adding (but also note that if somebody else's RDL career reaches a worthy level, I'm not directly against adding somebody - just against adding anybody before they have truly reached whatever ridiculously high bar I set in my head).

Sooo.... With all that said, it is very much my honor to be able to present to you my personal Hall of Greatness. I have had the very great pleasure of playing on teams with each of my selections in some capacity over the years (not always RDL, but certainly RDL for a long time for several of them). I believe the players I have chosen represent the very highest echelon of darting achievement that the RDL has ever seen, and I love that each of them has taken a pretty distinct path from the others in terms of how they have traveled the RDL path.

This year's five inductees are presented on the pages that follow, and they are presented in no order other than "alphabetical by last name." So don't try to read anything into the order, or try to guess if I have some ranking. The bottom line is that these five people all sit above the bar for extended supreme excellence. No ranking, just a brotherhood of people who have done it better than the rest of us for a very, very long time.

Without further ado, I present to you... the five new members of the Hall of Greatness...

Tom Brown comes to the Hall in the role of the endless winner. No matter where he plays, when he plays, with whom he plays, he just wins and wins and wins. Honestly, it has been quite a bit uncanny. While we will focus primarily on the RDL here, his incredible habit of winning has extended through decades of play in the nearby Bull City Dart League, the statewide North Carolina City Dart League, and shorter term endeavors such as the Cary Dart League and the Tobacco Road Dart League. I think maybe he never really lost anywhere because he never learned how and then never cared to learn.

Brown (known to quite a few around here as "BiggDogg") first threw darts in the Buffalo Area Dart League in western NY, winning his first title in the spring of 1988. After moving here in the early '90s, Brown started his North Carolina darting efforts in the Triangle Dart League in Chapel Hill. After a brief time there and in the BCDL in Durham, Brown was recruited to his first RDL team in the spring 1995 season, joining Pig Tour 95 (the very same first RDL team for yours truly). Only one year into his time with the Pigs, a dispute over the keeping of an embarrassing teammate splintered the team, sending a few of us in different directions. Brown's direction was to the already formidable Lunatic Fringe, and his arrival cemented Fringe as maybe the league's first real dynasty. In his 15 seasons with Fringe, their team collected an amazing 12 regular season and 10 tournament titles. But somehow, Brown was just getting started.
In the Fall of 2003, Brown made the somewhat alarming decision to leave Fringe to join seven players of my own team, creating an upstart squad known as The Subversive Element. In one fell swoop, to the surprise of roughly everyone including us members
 of Element, the history of the RDL changed. Brown switched teams, and the greatest dynasty in RDL history gave way to a somehow even greater RDL dynasty! As I noted before, Brown joins a team and it just wins. Just like that. And they never stop winning. As Element is the present A division regular season and tournament champion (in a fully undefeated season), it looks like Brown's teams certainly aren't done (or at least I hope they aren't!). You should definitely check out his team's win/loss records on page $5 \ldots$... wow.
Brown has actually collected every award the league offers... singles win percentage, all-star point average, perfect throws, fast games... literally every category (see summary on page 5). And he's done it without ever playing a day outside of A division. When you add in the fact that Brown is also a superb hockey player, a pretty decent golfer, and a very successful Financial Analyst/Business Manager, it kind of appears that Brown just goes through his day kicking ass. I would love to tell you that at least he's undependable
 or irresponsible, but I just can't do that. I've known him for three decades, and I'm not sure I know anyone more completely reliable in any context. Pretty disgusting, no?

My favorite Brown memory? It's actually a hundred little versions of the same event over and over. In the biggest moments in a match, Brown has a habit of throwing a dart right square in the middle of a triple, flatly asking of the chalker "score, please?" when we all know exactly what the score is, and then he takes a minor little walk away from the oche as he ponders the next dart. We, his teammates, call it The Tom Brown Stroll. I'm guessing our opponents kinda hate it, as they know just as we do, that nothing good is coming for them once this sequence is in motion. I can't count the number of titles of which I've been a part that have been fueled by a well-timed Tom Brown Stroll winner.

Jim Budelman's place among the RDL's Hall is that of the serious technician. Budelman always analyzed every little facet of the game, the board, the lighting, the situation, etc., more than any of the other top players here. I always knew the match wasn't fully on and moving until Budelman had walked to each board to determine how closely the bull's height was to that of his nose (or eyes, or whatever the heck he was lining up). He made the slightest of alterations in his release point and dart release power in response to his determinations, and based on the fact that he was one of the most consistent and precise throwers in league history, whatever he always did clearly worked.
Budelman first began throwing during his time in the U.S. Air Force. His brother Frank had been a good player as well, and he recruited Jim to be a last minute addition to their A league team in Washington DC. Within 3 years, Budelman's brother could rarely beat him anymore, and they played in DC's top division until Jim moved to southern California in roughly 1972. Somehow, players in California initially reached the conclusion that Budelman wasn't good enough to play in A division when he arrived, a mistake that was remedied soon thereafter by his buddy Craig Dusenberry, and together they ruled the league for about 6 years.
After a move to New Jersey that forced a minor pause in his dart action, Budelman retuned to California and started to become a nationally ranked tournament player. In 1992, Budelman finally moved to the Triangle area, and jumped right into his RDL career. That first year saw Budelman duke it out on behalf of A division's Barstools, but the team just couldn't quite keep their spot in the top division. That led to Budelman hopping over to Lunatic Fringe for more than 21 years, with him being one of the major driving forces
 that catapulted Fringe into being the RDL's first real dynasty. Fringe won the A division regular season title in 15 of the first 21 seasons in which Budelman played, and there was a 15 -season span during which Fringe also claimed 10 A division tournament titles. For roughly a decade, Budelman was widely acknowledged by members of the other teams as that one guy on his team that you had to list around, even when his roster featured several other top players.
Over the course of his RDL career, which was sadly cut a bit short by ongoing right elbow pain that prevented him from keeping the highly compact and repetitive throwing motion for which he was known, Budelman won at least one of every award the RDL gives out except for a 6-Bull (but since 6-Bulls are generally thrown by people who are behind, and Budelman was rarely ever behind). While it's a bummer that Budelman had to give up full-time darting, he certainly managed to fill his time with kicking ass on the golf course. He's

a near scratch golfer at frickin' Prestonwood Country Club. Clearly, coordination has never been an issue. My favorite Budelman memory? It came during my first year here in the RDL. In a huge match between A division heavyweights Lunatic Fringe (Jim's team) and Pig Tour 95 (my team), the match advanced to a tiebreaker. After Budelman missed a shot at the out in 1001, he disassembled his darts and put them back in his case. There were nearly a dozen top shooters (including several NC state champions) between Budelman and another shot, but somehow every one of us missed. When it came back around to Budelman, he hurriedly went to his case, assembled one dart, and went to the line and hit the out! When I said something to him about it, he said something to the effect of "well, it takes a little while to put these back together and I didn't want to make you guys all wait, so I just figured that if I was going to hit it, I might as well just go ahead and do it on the first one." Just decided to do it? That's what I've been missing?

## ROBBIE PHILLIPS -- 2023 Inaugural Class

If there is anyone among this group who needs no introduction to the majority of the RDL, it's most decidedly Robbie Phillips. His exploits, from local successes all the way to the world stage, have been recounted in the pages of the Tons probably more extensively than any other league member. It's almost beyond argument that Phillips carries the title of "best ever RDL player." In any case, he is certainly the most accomplished

Phillips first joined the RDL in 2001 when he was recruited to Brian Selby's super-deep Industrial Strength; he and Tom Brown are the only members of this year's Hall class who won both the A regular season and tournament titles in his first season in the league. After three seasons, Phillips switched over to the pre-Element team captained by yours truly, and he was a founding member of Element two seasons later.

In 2004, Phillips took a year to go to culinary school, and there evidently must have been dartboards hung in every kitchen at the school, because after he returned in 2005, it was time for him to start rewriting all the record books. He rejoined Element and immediately became a cornerstone of the RDL's most dominant dynasty, posting numbers never before seen in RDL on an almost seasonal basis. Eighteen years later, and almost nothing has changed.

You can very easily peruse Phillips's individual results on pages 10 and 11 , but some of the outcomes are so outrageous that they just need to be highlighted. For example, Phillips has more than 150 perfect throws in league play, and has anywhere from 1 to 69 -marks in all but one season since the start of 2005. He has won the A singles title 11 times, and he has claimed an A all-star average title in 21 of the 28 past seasons. He has claimed every award the RDL offers at least 3 times each (not surprisingly, 6-Bulls are one of the
 only two awards he has claimed fewer than 6 times; but quite a bit surprisingly, the other that he was claimed only 3 times is the High Out). Finally, while it's not an official RDL statistic, I have named Phillips to my A division all-star team 34 times in a row (and 36 in total), and I have named him the division MVP in 19 of those seasons.

And while being selected to this Hall is mostly about all the RDL achievements, it would be silly not to mention Phillips's additional honors elsewhere. Phillips has 31 NC State Championship titles, he has won 10 NC City Dart League championships, he has won roughly 20 Bull City Dart League titles, he has won multiple national championships, he has won a team World Cup event, and about a thousand other things. Just way too many to highlight in a one-page summary with photos. But probably a bigger achievement than all of these is the fact that somehow Phillips is not only one of the most gracious losers I've ever encountered, but he is also one of the most gracious
 winners as well. It's no secret why he is one of the most popular darters around, regardless of talent level. So very casual and approachable...
My favorite Phillips memory? Oh, there are some serious classics, as Phillips is one of the wittiest and humble intellects around... There's the greatest diddle in the history of darts... There are the dozens of walk-by perfect throws with my darts... There are clutch shots, windbreakers, comedy acts with no words, and a Slim Jim. But in the end, I'm going with a quick, subtle one. One night in SCkt, Robbie was playing and I was recording results on the sheet (which is out of the ordinary for us, I realize), and Robbie said "I got a 5 m , a 6 m , and a 3-bull." I looked at the sheet and replied with "I have the 5 and the 6 , but I didn't have the 3 -bull." Phillips quickly looked at me and said "I haven't hit it yet" with this awesome smirk. When he flatout buried the first dart on his next turn, you could almost feel the pressure in the room release...

If we recognize anyone in this Inaugural Class for paving his own unique path, it's clearly Mike Seward. While the others in this year's class ended up playing as teammates for large parts of their time here in the RDL, Seward very intentionally chose another avenue. While he did have a stint playing with both Element and Fringe, meaning he has been an RDL teammate of all four others in this group, those were very much not Seward's normal modus operandi. Seward's greatest pleasure in his competitive darting career has been to either... play on what might be an underdog contender who could very well win but isn't an expected favorite, or... to build an entirely new team out of very good players who aren't necessarily thought of as the historically key champion throwers. He has always just loved the challenge of facing the other top talents, but with maybe slightly lesser but hungrier talents as his teammates. And that path, while obviously expected to be tougher, has for the most part worked out quite gloriously. Seward started his RDL time in 1994 with Excalibur in C division, after a pretty funny intro to darts. He played his first 3 years of darts in his dad's basement "when he wasn't looking," and then one day he went to a friend's house and he and a friend were playing $\$ 5$ games. Seward hadn't played before, he used some crappy darts, and he took home $\sim \$ 25$. After telling his brother about it at Christmas time, his brother recruited him to Excalibur in C division with him, playing out of Browns Billiards. By his 2nd season, he was 22-2 in singles, which he hilariously attributes to throwing a lot of games with his buddy Jimmy Lloyd (Dangerboy from 106.1 FM or Maverick on 94.7 QDR) on their practice board that was probably $10+$ feet from the line to the face of the board.
In his early seasons in the RDL, Seward bounced around a little

bit among Excalibur, the Dart Bags, and the X-Men, with this last association being the one that first brought him into the A division fray. After a brief stint with Dart Shadows in 1998, and then a return to Excalibur for a few seasons, it was joining my own team in the Fall 2000 season that ended any minor dalliances with any division outside of A for Seward. After 5 seasons with my pre-Element team, Seward had a cup of coffee with Varina Sports Bar, then one year with Lunatic Fringe, then one year with Element, and then... Seward found his true RDL calling. Starting in the Fall 2006 season, he spent a full decade building and rebuilding team after team (many of those in continued partnership with Kenny Persson) of squads that everyone thought would be one of those "next step down" of good A teams... and team after team was actually fantastic and vying for both the regular season and tournament titles.
While Seward has never been as "marquee" as a couple others in this group, I assure you that from about 2004 through 2016, there
 was no season when Seward wasn't just about the most feared opponent on any team. He was just a terminator... and that form started to flash back up a bit just this season!
My favorite Seward moment? Oh, again there are so many (due in so small part to the fact that Seward is a major prankster, and is quite a master at the low-risk but high-impact). Fake newsletters, cars wrapped in caution tape, toilet paper with no starting point, and so many others. But I'm going with the night he was on my team, when he hit his beloved 170-In (yes, he throws for that crap) on his first turn, and he got all the way down to 2 before Joe Stevens even got in. And then Stevens plodded all the way down... and then out. And then we gave Mike a High In Award.

## WIL TAN -- 2023 Inaugural Class

Wil Tan is most decidedly here in the Inaugural Class as the unconventionalist of the group. Whereas many of the highest-end darters all play the same strategy in both ' 01 and cricket, game after game, season after season, we'll just say... Tan has not been one of those players. He is most well-known for his decades-long aversion to the 18 in cricket, despite the fact that he might have the single highest 18 s -per-dart average in the league's history. He routinely for years and years has plodded through a cricket board in his own fashion... 20 s , then 19 s , then 17 s , then 15 s , then $16 \mathrm{~s} \ldots$ then an internal struggle to decide whether it's straight to the bulls first, or whether it's to go clean up the 18 first. Mathematically, this entire strategy is indefensible. But maybe the simplest truth is that you should always play what works for you... and for Tan, this is what worked. And it worked a LOT (if you don't believe me, see "SCkt" and "DCkt" on page 16, and then note that nearly all of those stout numbers are in the upper reaches of A division).
Not to be left behind though, ' 01 strategies also found a home in the unique regions of Tan's brain. I'll never forget the couple years when he just decided that he wasn't going to hit the double-20, so he just threw a single- 8 from 40 unless he had only one dart left. And it's probably right about here that you think you're going to be witty and throw in a "can't hit the double-20 because he's short" joke... well, sorry buddy, but Tan took hold of all height jokes and made them at his own expense from day one, so any bite they might have was defused decades later. You're just going to have to accept that the short guy with the seemingly-foot-long darts just thumped you once again. Probably need to get used to it.
Tan joined the league in the early 1990s, although he honestly isn't sure what season. The earliest record I can find of him (the league records from before my time will never be called "complete") is showing up on F division's Sharkey's Slingers in the Fall 1993 season. He must have been noticed at the local blind draws or something, because the very next season he helped push 3 In a Bed right back into A division (where they became a competitive fixture in the title chase). After a season or two away, Tan joined Chris and Ron Wandscher on Top Dead Center, and immediately helped carry that team right up to A also. The real meat of Tan's RDL career took shape next as he joined my pre-Element team and led a band of seeming no-names all the way to 2 nd place in $A$, in a time when some were calling for a 4-team "Super A division" that included the "blatantly obvious 4 best A teams" (which somehow didn't include our 2nd place team, soooo... yeah). After a year away in 1999, Tan joined the very powerful Industrial Strength for a few years before returning to his prior home on my team to be a founding member of Element. He has been an Element for every season but one since then, and in that one, he
 popped over to help Mike Seward's first effort at making a new competitor in A (see Seward's page for further notes on that), and he quickly helped push that team right past Element in its first season. Then Tan came back to Element, and not coincidentally, Element very quickly returned to its spot at the top of A. Much in the style of all the guys being inducted today, winning just follows everywhere Tan goes.
My favorite Tan memory? Beyond so many dropped dollar bills, so many giddy times that he wrote up a cricket board with no 18 and his opponent didn't notice, I would have to say that my favorite is a hundred little instances of the same thing. Tan just loves to call me minutes before a match and act like he's at the wrong location. Over and over. It almost works sometimes, because he has indeed gone to the wrong place or just forgot to come. But sometimes I'm looking right at him while he calls from outside.
